### Uniform News

The volunteers managing our uniforms are providing an excellent service for all families. As of week two of next term, we are moving the uniform day to a **Tuesday morning** (8.30am – 9.30am) instead of **Wednesday** so that Mrs O'Leary can also support our volunteers. Note that the uniform shop will be open on the Wednesday for week one.

### Clarify Around Uniform Expectation

I am really pleased that the children display our values of Excellence and Appreciation, through always wearing the correct school uniform. There are a couple of areas where some clarification is needed with:

- Black School Jackets  
These should be worn in addition to the school jumper and not instead of on the days of formal uniform. If it is particularly cold outside the children can wear the jacket over the jumper. The children do not need to wear the jackets inside as the classrooms are warm.
- Black Leather School Shoes  
We have some children wearing black fashion shoes and even skate type shoes. Please ensure that the children wear black school shoes only.
- Hair  
Hair styles must be conservative and hair longer than collar length must be tied up. If hair is across the face it must be clipped back.

In sharing this, I also want to thank families for your efforts to uphold our high standard of uniform. It is a very visible sign of the pride we have in our wonderful community school. Please keep these pointers in mind as you prepare your children for third term.

### Faction Token System

Families may not be aware that we conduct a faction token competition. The tokens are awarded to children noticed by staff upholding our values and expectations in the playground. I also use it liberally to award tokens to the constant stream of children coming to me with excellent work. Mrs Sinclair coordinates and promotes this excellent initiative in our school. ## Thanks for the Term

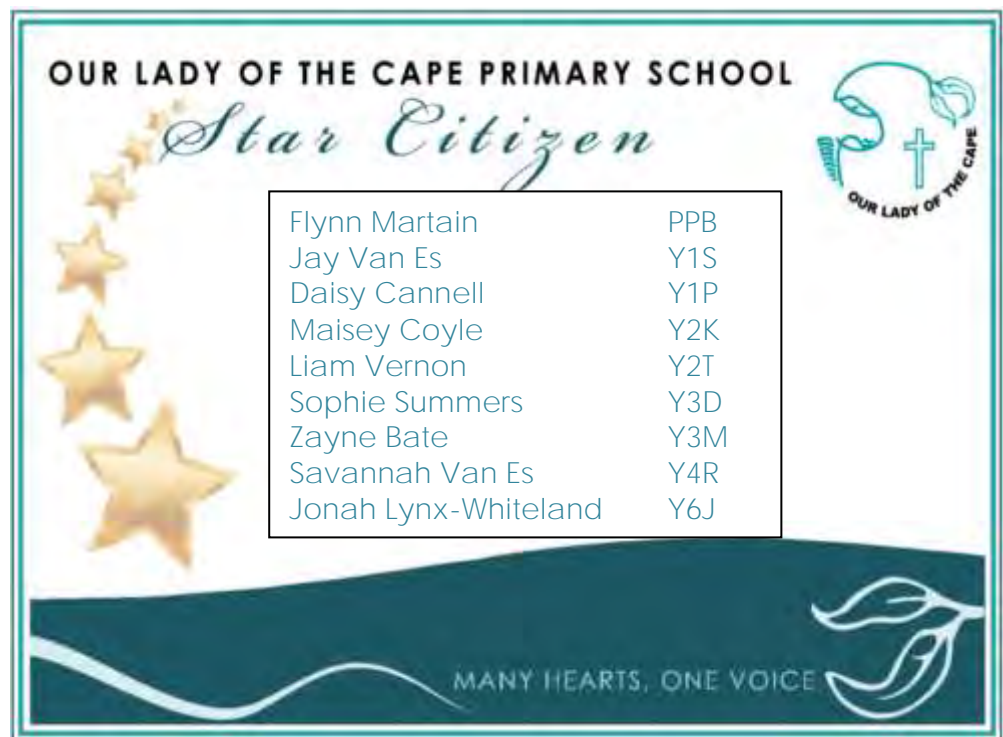
