This will also be the celebration of the Year 3 family mass and pizza will be shared by the students and their families afterwards. We would love to see you there! Mrs. Amie Meyer.





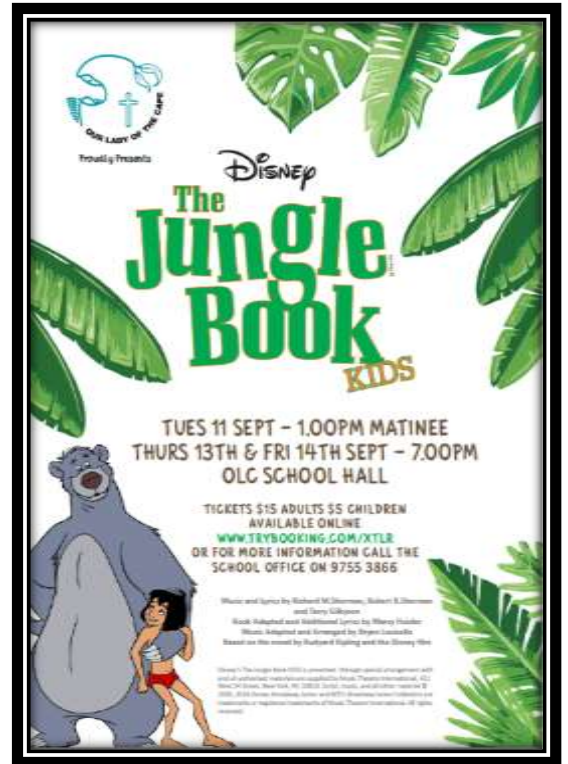

### **FREE Scoliosis Screening for Primary & High School Students.**

Scoliosis/Kyphosis (Scheuermann's Disease): these conditions relate to abnormal curvature of the spine.

Scoliosis is abnormal sideways curvature, and kyphosis is an abnormal forward curvature of the spine. The most common form of scoliosis is idiopathic. The cause is multi-factorial, and not completely understood. Depending on the degree of curvature treatment is hugely varied.

Scheuermann's disease is due to uneven bony growth of the mid-back vertebrae leading to wedging of the spine: this creates a forward curvature. The cause is unknown.

Common symptoms: back and neck pain and stiffness, obvious altered posture.

Risk factors: gender (female), age (prevalent in teenagers), family history.

Scoliosis is defined as a lateral curvature of the spine greater than 10 degrees accompanied by vertebral rotation. Scoliosis occurs most often during the growth spurt just before puberty (most common in girls aged 9-14).

Adolescent idiopathic scoliosis is present in 2 to 4 percent of children between 11 and 16 years of age. About 2% of girls have a curve which warrants medical observation. 3 girls per 1000 will require treatment during the growth phase.

If treatment is required the earlier it is undertaken the better the long-term result.
