From Fr Ian

"God saw their efforts to renounce their evil behaviour, and God relented; He did not inflict on them the disaster which he had threatened." Thus does the author of the book of Jonah records the gracious action of forgiveness by God to the people of Nineveh. It is interesting to note that the Prophet Jonah is highly important in Islam. Jonah is mentioned four times by name in the Quran and is the only one of the twelve minor prophets to be mentioned by name. Thus the story of repentance and forgiveness is wonderfully revealed and shared within these two faith traditions.

Fr Brendan Byrne in his 'Reflections on the Gospel' within our bulletin shares a remarkable insight into what is repentance and how it is to be situated in the core of our being, if it is to be of any worth. He writes "The repentance that is called for is not simply repentance for sin, but a change of heart or mind, and openness to a whole new vision of God and God's actions in the world – something that will shake prevailing structures and thinking, to their foundations.

On Tuesday morning, the 16th January, Betty Annal made her journey from this world to her true home in heaven. Betty was ready for the journey as her life was lived with God and in the service of the Kingdom. With her husband Harold, they were a powerful combination who advanced the Kingdom of God within this region. From the Bunbury Diocese we had a total of 50 participants and leaders that made the pilgrimage to Sydney for ACYF 2017. As a group leader I was given a group of 8 excited and faith filled participants. Even though being a leader was exhausting it was rewarding and made me feel like I was giving back from when I went as a participant in 2017.

We stayed at Mary MacKillop Place which holds the museum about Mary Mackillop's life and the Chapel where her body is now rests. As a past student of St Mary MacKillop College it was interesting hearing about Mary's life and the people she cared for.

The festival plenary sessions were just as alive as ACYF 2015 and it really shows how the young people are embracing their faith, particularly through music and prayer. Each session was based on the festival theme of: Open New Horizons for Spreading Joy.
