

OLC Student Leadership Model from 2023

Our Catholic Philosophy:

"If Catholic schools profess to develop the whole person academically, religiously, socially and morally, then an important element of that development entails explicit promotion of leadership, not only in positional leaders, but also with the entire student cohort" (*Student leadership in Catholic schools: A matter of service!* Hine & Lavery, 2013).

At Our Lady of the Cape Primary School, we believe that we need to foster a leadership model in our students that draws inspiration from Jesus. This is based on a model of inclusive leadership where all students have a legitimate role in exercising leadership with the belief that all students have the capacity to lead.

Consideration has been given to the student leadership process so that it does not disempower students at a young age by setting them apart.

We believe that all students should consistently demonstrate the school values, contribute to the school culture and identity, be involved in school activities, and take on some responsibilities. A service approach is fundamental to developing leadership skills under the guidance of key staff.

The OLC *Vision for Learning* emphasises the power of student voice in influencing change. In recognition of this and the Catholic Social Teaching principle of Social Justice, from 2023, **all Year 6 students will have a role** in identifying and actioning services they feel the school requires, within a collaborative team setting. This model of leadership facilitates the development of skills fundamental for 21st Century learners, to enable them to become global citizens who are critical thinkers able to collaborate, communicate and effectively solve problems as a collective group.

Rationale:

As of 2023 at Our Lady of the Cape Primary School, the development of lifelong leadership skills that draw inspiration from the model of Jesus will be an opportunity offered to all students in the Year 6 cohort. Having effective student leaders supports the development of responsible behaviours, a positive school tone and encourages students to model the school values of Compassion, Appreciation, Respect and Excellence, to live as Jesus taught us. Positive student leadership opportunities and experiences will facilitate the transition to secondary school and the world beyond. Student leadership is driven by service to others and is embedded in our school motto: "Many Hearts, One Voice".

Aim:

The purpose of this policy is to ensure that all students are supported and encouraged to:

- Follow the servant leadership model of Jesus Christ, emphasising the core school values of Compassion, Appreciation, Respect & Excellence.
- Develop a sense of belonging, responsibility, and partnership by working together to achieve leadership skills that will enhance and promote Our Lady of the Cape Primary School and develop 21st Century learners.
- Demonstrate respect for self, all people, and the environment.
- Strive for unity through cooperation with parents, staff, and other students.
- Aim high in all that they do by being exemplary role models.
- Have representation in some areas of decision making with an opportunity to share student voice.

Guidelines:

- The student leadership policy will be implemented and aligned to Our Lady of the Cape Primary School's vision and mission statements.
- Student leadership will be a shared leadership model and will involve all Year 6 students.
- Leadership positions of responsibility will be formally recognised at the commencement of each school year at the first whole school assembly.
- At the conclusion of Year 5, students will "apply" for 2 3 of the Leadership Team positions, by submitting an application (CV and covering letter), demonstrating why they are the best candidate for the job. These applications will be assessed by the Year 5 and 6 teachers and the OLC Leadership Team, who will award positions to the best placed candidates.
- Role appointments are for the duration of the whole school year.
- Applicants who wish to leave their appointment prior to the end of the year
 for a legitimate and compelling reason, must do so by submitting a letter of
 resignation, detailing their reasons for leaving. If resignation is accepted and
 where it is possible, (i.e. another position becomes vacant), staff will facilitate
 transfer to a new position. Please note, it may not always be possible for
 applicants to have a choice in their new position.
- Teams will meet with their OLC staff member leaders weekly during a lunch period, to make plans and hold relevant discussions.

Leadership Positions:

6 x Action teams involving a total of 60 students from Year 6, each lead by a
different staff member. Year 6 teachers will oversee the running of the whole
program on a Friday.


Members of the **Gardening Gurus** Team are responsible for:

- Feeding and harvesting the chickens.
- Weekly sale of produce eggs, worm wizz, vegetables.
- Seed Saving.
- Maintenance and upkeep of Mary's Garden.
- Maintenance and upkeep of the OLC Indigenous Garden.
- Posting social media updates to school garden Instagram page.
- School improvements, eg murals, signage, displays etc, linked to the school's cultural program.


Duty Statement:


Members of the **Sports Rangers** team are responsible for:
